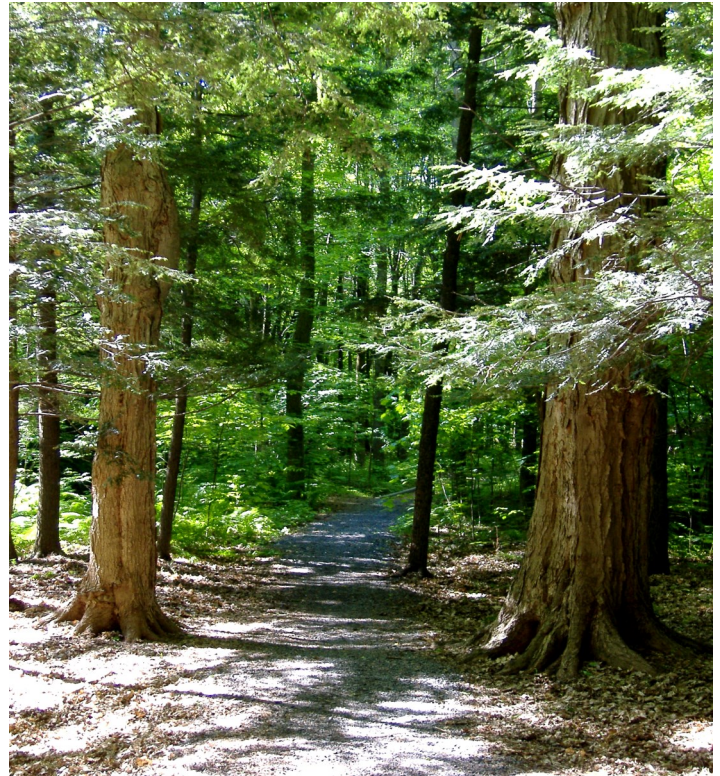

Site History

In 1980, the property was donated to South Nation Conservation (SNC) with the goal of maintaining forested area within the surrounding subdivision.

J. Henry Tweed Conservation Area (CA) consists of 16 acres of green space, and functions as a recreational park enjoyed year round by local residents and day-use visitors.

The area is known for its biodiversity and mature tree species, including maple and elm, making it the perfect place to discover nature.



Multiple Recreational Opportunities

Hikers and snowshoers can enjoy the fresh air along the many kilometers of well groomed trails year-round.

Geocachers can also discover a number of caches hidden throughout the CA.

Those interested in cycling or rollerblading, can access the Prescott and Russell Recreational Trail from the J. Henry Tweed trail, where they will find 72 kilometers of converted railway paths.
