Township prepares to demolish

WINCHESTER — It appears the former Flynn Hotel's doom is nigh.

The now-condemned structure — which, for a time, was known as the adult entertainment establishment Lulu's Sports Bar — is set to be destroyed.

At the most recent Township of North Dundas council meeting on Tues., May 11, CAO Howard Smith mentioned that loose ends had been tied up regarding the township's purchase of the property from a private owner.

Mayor Alvin Runnalls said he hoped the demolition would be "off and done" before the official opening of the nearby Chesterville waterfront redevelopment, set to be completed this summer.

Green streets in Chesterville

As reported previously in the *Winchester Press*, Chesterville received a \$15,000 grant from the TD Green Streets program. The money will be used to spruce up the village's waterfront, which is under construction as part of a \$1.6-million revitalization project.

At last week's council meeting, recreation director Mark Guy praised the efforts of Chesterville's Green Action Gang. (The group's volunteers filled out the application before the township submitted the paperwork to TD.)

Rose raises stink over biosolids

Deputy-Mayor Estella Rose isn't happy about local farmers spreading biosolids that appear to be coming from Ottawa.

Rose argued township councils should have more input before the controversial fertilizer — which consists of human feces — is spread on local fields.

"They're avoiding the Ottawa people," said Rose, noting that biosolids face strong opposition from city residents. "You hate to

be just a dumping ground."

The CAO recalled that councils used to have more input.

"We no longer have a say as a receiving township," said Smith.

Rose and Runnalls said they should bring up the issue during a United Counties of SD&G meeting.



'Sherrer Way' — has a ring to it, eh?

The access road leading into Winchester All Storage may soon be owned by the township.

The business owners have submitted a request for North Dundas to take over the road off St. Lawrence Street, to be named "Sherrer Way."

Planning director Calvin Pol said staff is waiting for compaction reports about the base of the road before making a recommendation to council.
