

Art and science at SNC

FINCH – Results of a fall scientific and artistic exploration along and around the South Nation River by the husband and wife team of Dr. Fred Schueler and Aleta Karstad will be showcased this Thursday (Nov. 24) with all those interested invited to attend.

“Art and Science in the South Nation Watershed” will open at 6 pm at South Nation Conservation’s Finch headquarters and continue until 8:30 pm, featuring a one-hour film celebrating International Year of the Forest along with the Schueler/Karstad project. Admission is free and refreshments will be served.

The project is a joint venture by SNC and Schueler and Karstad’s Bishops Mills Natural History Centre.

The couple will release a 57-page publication summarizing their expedition, complete with 19 renditions of Karstad’s South Nation paintings, observations about making each one, and biologist Schueler’s research notes about the landscape with special attention to interactions between native and invasive species.

Priced at \$22 each, the volumes are available for purchase in time for Christmas.
