FOREST RENEWAL & TENDING

Tree Planting:

The following Renewal & Tending targets were identified in approved silvicultural prescriptions for the subject SNC Forest compartments:

SNC 13 **4.8 hectares**

Plant 3.0 Pw in open areas where future harvest of Pr will have little or not negative affect on the developing regeneration. Plant at approximately 2.1m X 2.1m spacing. Spot tend (chemical application) for first two years following planting. Approximately 1,680 seedlings.

SNC 23 **4.9 hectares**

Plant 3.0 Pw in open areas where future harvest of Pr will have little or not negative affect on the developing regeneration. Plant at approximately 2.1m X 2.1m spacing. Spot tend (chemical application) for first two years following planting. Approximately 1,700 seedlings.

Invasive Species Control: **4.0 hectares**

Occurrences of Common and Glossy Buckthorn were treated on SNC 1 in 2018. Second-year mechanical and chemical tending is planned.

FOREST HARVEST

The SNC compartments listed in the activity schedules below have been identified in the SNC Forest Five-year operating plan and have been selected for the tendered sale of forest products during 2019 and 2020. The selected forest compartments approximate the allowable harvest area targets for the SNC Forest. Compartments inventoried during 2019 will be marked during 2020 following preparation of silvicultural prescriptions.

PROGRAMS

Forest Stewards

The involvement of volunteers on SNC land increase awareness and help educate community residents about the benefits of our forests on a social, economical and environmental basis. Residents will also recognize ownership of land and be able to communicate issues or concerns through proper channels. No changes are anticipated to the Forest Stewards program.

2019 BUDGET IMPACTS

Financial aspects of forest operations are included within the annual SNC Budget under Community Lands and SNC Forest.

Revenue

Current forecasted revenue from harvest operations is \$80,000 based on harvest contracts. Harvest revenue for 2019 is estimated at \$90,000.00. The revenue estimate is based on planned harvest areas and the most recent revenues per unit area (\$/ha).

Community Lands

Lands

Purpose:

- To manage property for current and future residents. SNC owns approximately 12,000 acres including: forests; wetlands; grasslands, and hazard properties. These properties provide environmental, social and economic benefits.
- To facilitate scheduled land operations and public access SNC follows an asset management plan.

Expenses:

- Salaries and Benefits: 1.9 FTE, increase \$54,689: \$182,847
- Travel and Training: increase \$1,000: \$7,500

SNC Forest

Purpose:

- To implement operations under the SNC 20-Year Forest Management Plan (2018-2037); SNC 5-Year Forest Operations Plan (2018-2023); and 2019 Annual Forest Operating Plan.
- These plans measure and assess the health of the SNC Forest, prescribe harvests that improve growth, improves forest health, regenerates forests, and identify recreational and economic opportunities for these community lands.
- To comply with SNC Forest Policy and Forest Stewardship Certification (FSC) standards. FSC is a third-party audit to ensure SNC manages their forest according to established standards.
- To engage volunteers through the SNC Forest Stewards program to help SNC monitor its land holdings.

Subject: Update: Maple Syrup Education Program

RECOMMENDATION:

The Forestry Committee receive and file the Maple Syrup Education Program report.

DISCUSSION:

In July, SNC announced that its recently acquired Oschmann Forest in North Dundas will be the new home of the Maple Syrup Education Program.

Since 2000, the not-for-profit program hosts over 1,000 students a year, providing them with a hands-on environmental learning experience at a local sugar shack. SNC plans to host students at the Oschmann Forest in the Spring of 2019.

This forest features an existing sugar shack, nature trails, a great natural legacy and boasts Municipal partnership opportunities.

Current updates to the property include the creation of a new parking lot, and upgrades to the existing 1.3 kilometer trail system throughout the property. SNC is currently constructing a 12'x18' pumphouse for sap collection and the property will have a pipeline installed in January. The property has been inventoried and tree marked, with plans of a small operational thinning to be completed in December by SNC staff.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS/ADHERENCE TO SNC POLICY:

Subject: Update: Ottawa Ash Tree Replacement Program

RECOMMENDATION:

The Forestry receive and file the Ottawa Ash Tree Replacement Program update report.

DISCUSSION:

The Board of Directors and City of Ottawa approved a special levy for 2018 to develop and deliver a program to offer cost-share funding to residents to replace trees lost to the Emerald Ash Borer (EAB).

The Ottawa Ash Tree Replacement pilot program launched August 15, 2018. The Program offers up to \$500 per tree, with a maximum of \$5,000 per applicant. A certified arborist or forestry professional must confirm the tree(s) is an ash and infected with the EAB. To qualify for the grant, removal of the infected trees must also be done by a forestry professional and a native tree(s) planted for every ash tree removed. Approved applicants have until June 30, 2019 to complete their project and submit required documentation.

As of November 16, 2018, all available funding has been allocated. A total of 95 applications are approved, allocating approximately \$166,000; resulting in the removal of 468 infected ash trees and replacement with native trees. Most of the approved projects will be completed in spring 2019.

Cost for removal and replacement varies depending on the applicant's location, number of trees to be removed, and location/accessibility of trees on the property. A summary of the approved projects is attached.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS/ADHERENCE TO SNC POLICY:

Compliance with Budget: This Program is not included in the SNC Budget; however, it was approved by the Board of Directors in November 2017, (RESOLUTION NO. BD-168/17) as Business Arising from 2018 Budget Report.

SNC Policy Adherence: Allocation of funding adheres to SNC's Purchasing Policy for approved signing limits.

DISCUSSION:

The Property and Forestry Teams are responsible for the safe and efficient management of all South Nation Conservation lands and Conservation Areas (CA). The Teams work with landowners to implement stewardship projects on private land that improve forest cover across the jurisdiction. Each year, the Teams undertake a wide variety of projects which provide cost-effective, professional services, to member Municipalities and partner organizations. The Teams also provides support to other SNC staff on a variety of program deliverables.
