


Communications Committee Meeting Jessup's Falls, July 30, 2021




Recreation: Conservation Area Use – Monthly Stats







Local Climate Change Initiatives






- Staff studying the impacts of local climate change on water resources

Ottawa River


- Letters to over 1500 residents




Delivering shared programs South Stormont

 Planner to discuss priorities




Planning Activity Comparison by Year

 - 389 applications by August 2021




SNC Portal Improvements
