Discover a Rich History

Cass Bridge Conservation Area was purchased by South Nation Conservation (SNC) in the spring of 1983. The property consists of land acquired during the Chesterville Channelization Project during 1979-1984, land purchased from the Ministry of Transportation Canada, and land purchased from Mrs. Pearl Carkner, on behalf of the Eastern Valley Heritage Foundation.

Cass Bridge received its name from its close proximity to the Cass Bridge itself, which crosses the South Nation River south of Winchester. The iconic bridge can be viewed from the shoreline.



Your Window to Scenic Views

Known as the perfect stopover along County Road 31 to enjoy the relaxed atmosphere and connect with nature.

The Conservation Area boasts some of the most scenic views of the River. Visitors often relax and enjoy the tranquility of the placid waters from the observation area, have a picnic under the trees, or have an adventure on the play structure.

Spread across 2.6 acres, the park features River access with a floating dock and excellent fishing opportunities.
