#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

The Fish and Wildlife Committee receive and file the OPG Regional Biodiversity Program update.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

SNC was successful in applying for funding from Ontario Power Generation through their Regional Biodiversity Funding Program for a combined Lakes/Rivers and Woodlands project. The funding awarded is \$200,000 divided over 3 years.

The Lakes/Rivers component of the project consists of shoreline stabilization and instream habitat creation along a stream which flows through J. Henry Tweed Conservation Area. This is a continuation of similar work completed on the property in 2019. The overall objective is to increase riparian and instream biodiversity, which will improve the ecological features and functions in the Conservation Area.

Activities planned for 2020 include:

- Investigating the source of upstream discharge
- Field assessment of past erosion control projects
- Field survey of in-stream debris removal locations
- Professional survey of the property
- Project communications plan

The Woodlands component of the project consists of invasive species control on SNC's Gamble and Garlandside Road properties. Using drone-acquired low-level aerial photography approximately 20, 20 m radius circle plots will be set in locations of highest concentration of Ash mortality and advanced Glossy Buckthorn populations. Glossy buckthorn will be felled and removed from the plot and stumps will be treated with a systemic herbicide. Native trees and shrubs will be planted within each treated area.

Activities planned for 2020 include:

- Site selection and plot layout
- Establishing and upgrading property access
- Updating management and stewardship plans
- Construction and installation of nesting boxes and hen houses
- Removal of some hazard trees
- Project communications plan

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

The Fish and Wildlife Committee receive and file the Catchment Study Update.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

South Nation Conservation undertakes monitoring initiatives to assess the condition of local river catchments. Funding was provided in 2020 under the Eastern Ontario Water Resources Program as a special project with the City of Ottawa to finalize the North Castor River Catchment Study and begin field work associated with the South Bear Brook Catchment Study.

These projects include the collection of baseline surface water quantity and quality data to support City of Ottawa subwatershed reporting initiatives, and recommendations for best management practices to protect and enhance water resources. Study updates are provided below.

#### North Castor Catchment

Baseline data was collected in 2018 and 2019. Data is currently being analyzed and summarized into a final report. The report also provides a summary of past restoration projects achieved, recommendations for future rehabilitation with the catchment, as well as constraint mapping related to groundwater-surface water interactions throughout the study area.

A presentation, including results on investigative efforts and recommendations will be provided at the next Fish and Wildlife Committee.

#### South Bear Brook Catchment

This is a two-year study, with data collection occurring in 2020 and 2021. Data collected in 2020 includes:

- Baseflow
- Water quality (via grab samples and deployment of long-term water quality sensors)
- Temperature (via deployment of several long-term sensors)
- Biological communities benthic invertebrates and fish



A report summarizing completed 2020 monitoring activities will be brought to the Fish and Wildlife Committee.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

The Fish and Wildlife Committee receive and file the 2020 Monitoring update.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

Each year, a wide variety of environmental projects are undertaken which require the collection, analysis and reporting of scientific data. This work begins in the spring once the majority of the snow on the landscape has melted and the watercourses are ice-free. Some of this work has been impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

SNC developed standard operating procedures (SOP) to specifically address protecting staff and the public from transmission of COVID-19 while performing field work. Procedures are used in conjunction with other relevant Health and Safety Policies. All SNC field activities require work plans with detailed job tasks and measures to specifically address COVID-19 transmission (e.g. social distancing, personal protective equipment, etc.). These documents are updated based on information and direction provided by government and health authorities.

For all work activities, staff travel to work sites in separate vehicles, maintain minimum distances of 2 metres from others, and have their own assigned personal protective equipment. Staff do not share equipment and tools.

#### Headwater Drainage Features

As part of the South Bear Brook Catchment Study, 30 headwater drainage features were to be assessed in 2020. This work is typically completed over a one- or two-week period early in the spring when there is water present in these small, temporary drainage features.

The work started early in April, following the new SOP, but it was quickly realized that it was not feasible. The sites were located along roadways with heavy traffic and staff had difficulty hearing each other while staying 2 m apart. The sites were also large enough to require 2 staff to handle the same equipment to complete the data collection.

The decision was made to postpone this work until 2021.



#### **Biological Community Sampling**

Fish sampling is planned for this summer as part of the South Bear Brook Catchment Study. The planned methodology is to use trap nets which is feasible while following the requirements in the SOP.

Municipal drain classification work is planned for July and typically involves backpack electrofishing. It is not possible to electrofish effectively while keeping 2 m apart. Trap netting is allowable under the required methodology for classification. If physical distancing is still required at the time of sampling, trap netting will be the methodology used.

Benthic invertebrate sampling occurs annually in the Fall using nets to collect invertebrates by kicking up the substrate. The work requires 2 staff; however, they do not need to be in close proximity and staff will have no difficulty adhering to the SOP.

#### Water Quality Sampling

The Provincial Water Quality Monitoring Network (PWQMN) is a long-standing partnership program with the Ministry of Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP). Typically running from April to November, water samples are collected monthly from 14 stations within the watershed and sent to the MECP lab for a detailed analysis. This program is currently on hold as the MECP lab was closed due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Through a special levy from the City of Ottawa, SNC completes water quality sampling at 12 locations within the City. Water samples are collected monthly during ice free conditions and delivered to the City of Ottawa lab for analysis. Financial constraints at the City resulting from COVID-19 caused a reduction in the special levy provided for this program. The sampling duration has been reduced from 9 months to 6 months, with the first sample collection occurring in July.

#### City Stream Watch

This program is volunteer-based and involves walking a length of watercourse and recording morphological characteristics of the watercourse, as well as identifying areas in need of stewardship activities. All work with outside volunteers has been postponed. Staff are modifying the data collection portion of this program so that meaningful information can be collected while adhering to the SOP.

Other planned monitoring activities include survival assessments of past riparian planting projects, groundwater well maintenance and manual water level readings, and invasive species distribution mapping on SNC properties. These activities can be completed by one staff person and will adhere to the SOP.
