Update: SNC Tree Planting Program

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

The Board of Directors receive and file the SNC Tree Planting Program update.

#### DISCUSSION:

South Nation Conservation (SNC) has provided a Tree Planting Program to landowners for over 20 years, planting more than 3 million trees across the jurisdiction. The Program has received Provincial support through the 50 Million Tree Program (50MTP) since 2008.

SNC is a Program Delivery Agent for the 50MTP which is coordinated by Forests Ontario. Each year, the Board approves a fee schedule for tree planting, SNC conducts landowner site visits, organizes tree orders, and coordinates site preparation, tree planting, and tending services for qualifying sites (minimum size of 1 hectare or 2.5 acres). SNC also offers Over the Counter tree sales for smaller planting projects that do not meet the 50MTP requirements. Landowners are responsible for site preparation, planting and tending of their trees when purchased Over the Counter.

The Board of Directors approved the 2020 SNC Tree Planting Program Fee Schedule at the April 18, 2019 Board meeting. A week later, the Province cancelled the 50MTP ending their funding commitment as of fall 2019. In early June 2019, the Federal Government announced funding for the 50MTP through Environment and Climate Change Canada.

New 50MTP details were provided to Program Delivery Agents on September 6, 2019. Technical planting criteria for tree species, site size, etc. are relatively unchanged; however, funding amounts have been modified. The table below outlines the old 50MTP and the new federally funded Program starting in 2020.

	Old Provincial 50MTP (2008 – 2019)	New Federal 50MTP (2020)
Delivery Agent Fee (per tree)	\$1.46	\$0.30
Tree Grant (per tree seedling)	\$0.20 conifers \$0.50 hardwoods	75% of tree seedling cost, paid directly to nursery
Cost to Purchase Trees	Delivery Agent invoiced total amount of trees purchased	Delivery Agent invoiced remaining 25% of purchase amount

SNC staff have compared the old and new 50MTPs, a status quo 2020 Tree Planting Program (from the landowner's perspective) can be offered for approximately the same SNC



contribution as 2019. With the Board approved 2020 tree seedling prices and a reduced cost to SNC to purchase trees, SNC will offer the following to projects that meet the new 50MTP criteria:

- \$0.20/conifer tree grant
- \$0.50/hardwood tree grant
- Site preparation, planting and tending services, as needed

The Over the Counter tree sales would also remain status quo at the approved tree seedling prices.

Global budget implications are forecasted to stay the same at approximately \$15,000 to \$20,000 of levy.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

The Board of Directors approve entering into an agreement with FedDev Ontario to receive \$31,500 in funding through the Canadian Experiences Fund.

#### DISCUSSION:

SNC has received funding from the Canadian Experiences Fund to help develop land to be donated by Augusta Township along the South Nation River (BD-097/19).

Funding of \$31,500 will help create a parking area and trail, along with hazard tree management, tree planting, and property signage.

In October 2018, the SNC Board approved negotiating a potential Conservation Area with Augusta Township, contingent on a transfer of land from the Township (BD-181/18).

A Memorandum of Agreement for the Conservation land will be entered into with Augusta Township.

#### RECOMMENDATION:

The Board of Directors receive and file the report for the Estimated Statement of Operation for the year ending December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2019, as of August 31<sup>st</sup>, 2019.

#### DISCUSSION:

The Net Overall amount represents total expenditures, operating, capital, and project, minus total revenue. The operational budget is defined as the day to day expenses the Authority needs for their normal activities. Expenses for projects are normally for a fixed term period of time. Capital expenditures are defined as per SNC's *Tangible Capital Assets Policy* revised in October 2017. "Tangible" capital assets are goods that have a life expectancy of more than one (1) year, and costs normally over \$5,000, with some exceptions. This Policy can be reviewed at any time, if necessary.

Senior Management, Team and Project Leads are estimating a surplus of \$330,000 at this time. A full review of 2019 estimates will continue until end of year.
