## **DISCUSSION:**

In March, the Communications Committee approved amendments to South Nation Conservation's (SNC) Community Environmental Grants Program to allow applications for tree and shrub planting and community garden development in response COVID-19 related event cancellations (NO. CMN-036/20).

The Committee also directed staff to engage with community groups and past project partners to support new funding applications (NO. CMN-036/20).

The following applications for the amended Community Environmental Grants Program have been received:

#### **Russell Township**

Russell Township is in the planning phases of a community garden project. The garden will be located on municipal property between the villages of Embrun and Russell, near the Township Dog Park and in the future area of the Recreation Complex. The project is ongoing, with construction of the garden expected in late 2022 or early 2023.

Funding from this grant, if awarded by SNC, would help towards the costs for the project. The community garden will be managed by the Township.

#### Ecole publique de la riviere Castor

Ecole publique de la riviere Castor is looking to purchase 5 lilac trees for their schoolyard. Planting these new trees will help students to learn more about tree planting, science and will incorporate the outdoors into their learning.

Funding from this grant will be used to purchase the trees and the third-grade class will be responsible for the planting and care of the trees.

The Township of Russell is pleased to submit our application for funding through South Nation Conservation's 2021 Community Environmental Grants Program. Our project is a community garden, as part of our goal to fostering healthy communities in the Township 2019-2022 Strategic Plan.

The Township is in the planning phases of this community garden project. The garden will be located on municipal property between the villages of Embrun and Russell, near the Township Dog Park and in the future area of the Recreation Complex. The project is ongoing, with construction of the garden expected in late 2022 or early 2023.

Funding from this grant, if awarded by SNC, would help towards the costs for the project. Submitted with this application is an online price for one 4 x 8 raised garden bed, being an example of where the funding may be used for the project. The Township will include this project in the municipal budget (final budget subject to Council approval) and will have sponsorship opportunities for local business and community groups to make donations.

The Township of Russell is working with the municipal Environmental Advisory Committee, consulting with the Horticultural Society, and is discussing involvement with the United Way. The community garden will be managed by the Township and will not require on-site support from SNC staff.

Work relating to the project is being conducted virtually at this time, minimizing risk involved with COVID-19. The Township will continue to follow all appropriate public health guidelines from the Eastern Ontario Health Unit to ensure the safety and health all involved.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

The COVID-19 pandemic and physical distancing measures have forced SNC to either change the way fundraising events take place or cancel them altogether, such was the case with the 2021 Friends of SNC Golf Tournament.

Wanting to still pursue a Fall fundraising event, staff recommend bringing back the "Art for Trees" online auction for a second year, given its success in 2020; nearly \$7,000 was raised to support the Free Tree Pick Up campaign in Spring 2021 (CMN-045/20, CMN-004/21).

Staff are requesting Committee suggestions on other fundraising ideas or initiatives that would assist in raising funds for projects and education.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

South Nation Conservation (SNC) Staff have begun to brainstorm ideas for SNC's 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration happening in 2022. Staff will continue to bring a recurring report to the Committee throughout 2021/2022, as plans for the anniversary celebration progress.

Staff are seeking suggestions for anniversary celebration activities that could be hosted throughout 2022. Some ideas to date include:

- A 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary SNC logo for use on letterhead, etc.
- Reaffirmation of the signing of the incorporation of SNC
- Ice fishing event (during free fishing weekend in February)
- Open house at SNC office (workshops, demos, staff meet and greet)
- Taste the Nation (engage with local restaurants to offer a discount on certain menu items the "SNC Special") Summer Event
- Partner with local brewery to create 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary beer with proceeds from every can/bottle/pint sold donated to SNC to support projects and initiatives that directly impact the health of area lands and waterways
- 75,000 trees to be planted throughout the jurisdiction
- Social media campaign of historical milestones for SNC
- Take a Hike SNC 75km Challenge walk, hike, run, paddle, bike 75km on SNC properties in 2022.
  - Receive a free t-shirt upon registration. Other prizes if you tag us at each SNC location, i.e. 5 CAs receive x, 10 CAs receive x, all CAs receive x.

Staff are also seeking feedback on what level of effort is appropriate for the anniversary celebrations and is there a particular theme that SNC should focus on for the 75<sup>th</sup>.

Based on discussions, staff will prepare a work plan for the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrations, to be presented at the September meeting.
