






Eastern Ontario LiDAR Partnership

Informing Land Use Decisions




On-the-ground monitoring in Bear Brook River Carlsbad Springs, Ottawa

- Preparing the South Bear Brook Catchment Study in 2022 to support sub-watershed planning
- Finalizing clear recommendations for the North Castor River catchment Report

Ottawa River Erosion Hazard Map

- Regulated Area includes assessment of erosion hazards
- Current projects:
 - Bear Brook: approx. 88 km
 - Ottawa River: approx. 120 km

- Trail Grooming at seven
 Conservation Areas
- Russell Recreation Trail and Nokomis Park (through municipal agreement)
- Over 35 kms of groomed trails throughout the jurisdiction

Tree Management Update

- Addressing EAB infested ash trees along trail network
- Trees were identified in annual Tree Risk Assessment
- Wood to be sold to local fuelwood producer
- Trail remains open to users evenings and weekends



Protecting People and Property: Chesterville Dam



Chesterville Dam, North Dundas

Updates to Chesterville Dam Walkway

- New gates installed to limit access of motorized vehicles
 - Ensures pedestrian right of way
 - Increased public safety
 - Protects surface structure and limits future damage



Protecting People and Property: Stop Log Replacement



Water Infrastructure Maintenance

- 73 stop logs are used at the Chesterville Dam
- 10 stop logs now replaced
- Retired stop logs are retained for emergencies or repurposed in other projects



Protecting People and Property: Watershed Conditions Monitoring



South Nation River Ice Survey, February 2021 Crysler, North Stormont

Snow and Ice Surveys

- Surveys support water management including Flood Forecasting
- Measuring characteristics such as depth and density to calculate "Snow Water Equivalent"
- 17 ice survey locations
- 7 snow survey locations

2021 Census Data for SNC Watershed

- Population change since 2016
- Significant residential growth within the jurisdiction
- Casselman, Ottawa, Russell had highest population increases
- Stormont County added 987 new residents
