

RECOMMENDATION:

The Clean Water Committee receive and file the SNC Standing Committee Membership update.

DISCUSSION:

In February 2022, the Board of Directors approved extending 2021 South Nation Conservation (SNC) Standing Committee membership for 2022, with the intention to undertake membership recruitment this fall for the 2023-2024 term (BD-026/22).

Most Committee members have participated on a Standing Committees for over ten years and are familiar with SNC and its programs and services. Committee member connections to various stakeholder groups is key in building support for ongoing delivery of programs and services (e.g., private landowner stewardship) as SNC transitions to new requirements under the amended *Conservation Authorities Act*.

Staff are preparing a work plan for municipal engagement on SNC programs and services, which will be brought to the Committee at their November 2022 meeting, the support of Standing Committee members is especially important with the upcoming Municipal election, as new Councillors may not be familiar with SNC and its landowner stewardship initiatives.

As such, the SNC Board of Directors has approved maintaining current Standing Committee memberships into 2023. While a formal call for Committee membership would not occur until 2023, the Executive can address any individual requests that are submitted in the interim.

This erosion control project was approved at the September 13th, 2021 under the Clean Water Program with a completion deadline of September 30th, 2022.

The landowner contacted staff and advised them that the contractor doing the work was delayed, the landowner is asking for approval for an extension deadline to allow for project completion by November 30th, 2022.
