Subject:	Update: Estimated Statement of Operations for May 31 st , 2023

RECOMMENDATION:

The Board of Directors receive and file the Estimated Statement of Operations for the year ending December 31st, 2023, as of July 31st, 2023, update.

DISCUSSION:

The Net Overall amount represents total expenditures, operating, capital, and project, minus total revenue. The operational budget is the day-to-day expenses the Authority requires for normal activities. Expenses for projects are normally for a fixed term period. Capital expenditures are as per SNC's *Tangible Capital Assets Policy* revised in August 2021. "Tangible" capital assets are goods that have a life expectancy of more than one (1) year, and costs normally over \$5,000, with some exceptions. This Policy can be reviewed at any time, if necessary.

Currently, Senior Management, Team, and Project Leads are estimating a surplus of \$52,000. A full review of 2023 revenues and expenditures will continue through to the end of 2023.

The final 2023 reserve transfer will be presented to the Board along with the audited financial statements at the March 2024 board meeting.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Board of Directors approve extending the geotechnical reviews service contract with Palmer Environmental Consulting Group to June 2024 to an upset limit of \$100,000.

DISCUSSION:

South Nation Conservation (SNC) reviews geotechnical reports and provides technical advice as part of its provincially delegated role under the *Planning Act* and issuance of permits under the *Conservation Authorities Act*.

SNC's in-house Hydrogeologist left in February 2023. As an intern measure, SNC engaged a consulting company to complete geotechnical reviews on its behalf. A request for quotes was sent to 14 consulting companies with recognized geotechnical expertise; SNC received three quotes. SNC retained Palmer Environmental Consulting Group (Palmer) under a contract with an upset limit of \$15,000.

SNC continues to require external support for geotechnical reviews as the volume of reports continues to be steady. Palmer has been providing high quality review services. Staff recommend an extension to Palmer's contract to an upset limit of \$100,000 until June 2024.

Development review fees offset the cost for Palmer's review services.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS/ADHERENCE TO SNC POLICY:

<u>Compliance with Budget</u>: Technical reviews were included in the budget under Approvals, Development Review, pages 46 and 47.

<u>SNC Policy Adherence</u>: The geotechnical review service contract adheres to clause (C) iv, SNC's Purchasing Policy (purchases \$25,000 up to \$100,000). A request for quotes process was completed for consultant selection.

<u>Program and Services Category</u>: Category 1: Mandatory Programs – Provincially delegated review of natural hazards under the *Planning Act* and administration of Section 28 of the *Conservation Authorities Act* and Ontario Regulation 170/06.
