




Landcover in Eastern Ontario Update






Bear Brook Watershed Flood Hazard Mapping

- Hydrology and Hydraulic Modeling




Bear Brook Watershed Study



- Agreement signed with City of Ottawa for 3-year Bear Brook Watershed Study
- Working on Phase 1: Characterization Report
- Includes contract with Aquanty to build water budget



Erosion Hazard Mapping: Slope Stability



3D representation of slope digitized along the Bear Brook.

- Delineated approximately
 125 km of slope
- Supports the identification of erosion hazards and development of SNC regulated area



Municipal Drainage Concerns





June & July Conservation Area Stats 2021 - 2023






Bob Graham Phragmites Control



- Phragmites monitoring and removal at Robert Graham Conservation Area
- Higher population densities reported in both new and pre-existing locations
- Requires ongoing management via spading and seed-head cutting




The Healing Place



- Funding secured by Plenty Canada to complete the Children's Butterfly Garden
- Hosting a harvest gathering and clean up on October 4th
- EOFNWG meeting in person/virtual September 8th @ SNC Office



European Water Chestnut Removal



- Conducted management efforts to remove EWC from the Castor and South Nation Rivers
- Removed over 2,000 plants since the beginning of July
- SNC was joined by a team from the Invasive Species Centre
- Requires ongoing monitoring and management



Municipal Partnerships: Stormwater Management

Stormwater Facility Management

- Control woody vegetation in stormwater infrastructure to improve function and capacity
- Cost-recovery partner program



Salvage Operation SNC 69 & 105



Salvaged area, SNC 105, Clarence-Rockland

- Operations completed July 24th
- All wood picked up by August 11th
- Over 570 tons of sawlogs salvaged
- Over 500 tons of biomass salvaged (to be confirmed)
- Planning to begin reforestation in fall 2023 (site prep fall 2023, planting spring 2024)



Derecho Storm Recovery Program



Heavily damaged trees, private property, Wendover

- 55 eligible applications received
- 6 ineligible applications
 (less than 4ha, ineligible retroactive expenses, or outside eligible area)
- 9 visits completed (up until August 17th)
- Site visits continue through August-October
- Site prep and salvage operations to start fall 2023
- Planting to start spring 2024



- Inventory of all landscape areas completed (17 parks total)
- Over 467 trees inventoried
- Species diversity report and recommendations in progress



Municipal Partnerships: Forestry Services



Assessed ash tree for removal

Township of Edwardsburgh/Cardinal

- Completed tree risk assessments to mitigate effects of 2022 severe storm events
- Developing tree planting plans and coordinating planting where necessary



Tree Planting Program Update



2023 completed project 2,200 trees South Stormont

- 20 site visits completed
- 32 more in site visits in queue
- 31,700 trees confirmed to date for spring 2024
