RECOMMENDATION:

The Board of Directors approve the 2024 General and Capital Levies at \$4,489,413; and

FURTHER THAT: the Board of Directors approve the 2024 Budget as presented.

BACKGROUND:

The Board of Directors received the proposed 2024 general levy and approved the Ottawa Special Levies at the October Board meeting (Res. No. BD-174/23). In November 2023, staff presented the draft 2024 Budget and directed staff to update the final draft to reflect a \$50,000 capital levy (Res. No. BD-196/23). Both the updated draft 2024 Budget and proposed levies were circulated to member municipalities following the November meeting.

The 2024 Budget reflects the Board's budget direction of a 2.5% plus growth levy increase, plus a \$50,000 capital levy. The 2024 Levy Schedule is attached.

Comments from member municipalities were requested prior to the January 18th, 2024 Board meeting. To date, no comments have been received.

The 2024 Budget is a policy document. All purchases are subject to SNC's Purchasing Policy and Board approval at future meetings. New programs must be duly debated and approved by the Board.

Ontario Regulation 402/22 under the *Conservation Authorities Act* requires a weighted majority vote to approve apportionment and that the vote be recorded. A municipality shall not have a weighted vote of more than 50% of the total weighted value for all of the votes unless the municipality appoints more than 50% of the members the Authority's Board of Directors.

The following table summarizes the apportionment of votes by appointed Board members. Only members present can vote for their respective percentage, it cannot be combined with an absent member. A weighted majority of 51% of the present members carries the vote.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Board of Directors approve the payment of the 2024 Conservation Ontario Levy of \$36,493, payable in two installments of \$18,246.50.

DISCUSSION:

Each year SNC must pay a levy to Conservation Ontario (CO). CO helps to further the work of Conservation Authorities (CA) at the provincial level.

CO levy is determined by placing all CAs on a mathematical regression curve, using a three-year average of gross revenues to determine placement. The larger a CA's revenue, the larger their levy payment, but at a lower marginal rate.

SNC's 2024 CO levy apportionment of \$36,493 represents a 2.53% increase over 2023, whereas CO's total levy request from all CAs increased by 3.27% from 2023 to 2024.

RECOMMENDATION:

WHEREAS the SNC Administrative By-laws designate signing officers for the Authority (s30.1 and 30.2); and

WHEREAS for banking purposes, the Authority's signing officers are one of: Chairman; Vice-Chairman; or Past Chairman; and one of: Chief Administrative Officer, Secretary-Treasurer; or Director of Finance

BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The signing officers are authorized to borrow up to \$1,000,000 for the operation of the South Nation River Conservation Authority, if required.
- 2. Staff be authorized to continue the use of alternative signatures, such as the signature stamp for signing cheques up to \$25,000, or other limits requested by the Board of Directors, or any other electronic signatures introduced in conjunction with our accounting software. These tools are in the custody of the Director of Finance. The Director may delegate the use of these tools to his/her delegate.
- Staff continue to utilize various banking features to make payments more cost efficient for SNC, for example: the use of internet banking, electronic fund transfer (EFT) and/or by other electronic means. All payments are presented regularly to the Board of Directors for approval in the "Monies Received and Disbursement Register for the period".
- 4. The Royal Bank, Winchester Branch, be the Authority Bank and that signing officers execute the banking services contract.

AND FURTHER THAT the Chartered Accountants Firm of Baker Tilly REO LLP, Winchester be appointed Auditors at an approximate cost of \$31,000 plus HST; and

FURTHER THAT the law firm of Ault & Ault LLP, Winchester be appointed as solicitor for general Authority business, and that Emond Harnden, Ottawa be appointed the Authority's Human Resource legal counsel, at a total approximate cost of \$20,000 plus HST. Where in the best interest of the Authority, staff may engage other specialized legal services.



DISCUSSION:

The South Nation River Conservation Authority Administrative By-law requires annual resolutions for the appointment of the Authority's auditor and financial institution and the borrowing resolution.

Also included are resolutions for the Authority's signing officers, confirming the use of alternate signing tools and the appointment of Authority solicitors including approximate cost.

The Authority's general counsel, Ault & Ault, will be consulted and advice sought when selecting specialized legal services.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS/ADHERENCE TO SNC POLICY:

<u>Compliance with Budget</u>: The dollar amounts noted have been included in the 2024 Budget under Corporate Services, pages 78 to 81.

<u>SNC Policy Adherence</u>: SNC's Administrative By-laws require the Board of Directors annually appoint or confirm the Authority's auditor, financial institution, solicitor(s), and borrowing authorization. SNC's Purchasing Policy section E) requires Board of Director approval for non-competitive purchasing over \$25,000 when professional or special services are required such as: auditors or accounting fees, legal fees, appraiser fees, banking fees, or any other special service.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Board of Directors approve the Final Transition Report for submission to the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry.

The province implemented the first phase of *Conservation Authorities Act* regulations in October 2021. The regulations require each conservation authority have a transition plan in place by December 31st, 2021, and create an inventory of programs and services by February 28th, 2022. These documents initiate consultations with member municipalities prior to the Transition Date of January 1st, 2024.

The Board approved South Nation Conservation's (SNC) Transition Plan on November 18th, 2021 (BD-197/21). Staff circulated the Transition Plan to member municipalities and the province and posted it on SNC's website. The Board approved SNC's Programs and Services Inventory (the "Inventory") on February 17th, 2022 (BD-023/22). The Inventory lists the programs and services SNC currently delivers and intends to deliver in the future. Staff circulated the Inventory to member municipalities and the province and held a municipal presentation regarding the Inventory on February 24th, 2022.

Regulations require SNC provide quarterly updates as consultations take place and the Inventory is refined. A total of six progress reports are to be submitted on the following dates:

- July 1, 2022 [submitted]
- October 1, 2022 [submitted]
- January 1, 2023 [submitted]
- April 1, 2023 [submitted]
- July 1, 2023 [submitted]
- October 1, 2023 [submitted]

Regulations also require SNC provide a final transition report withing 30 days after the transition date (January 1st, 2024). This final report will be submitted to the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry (MNRF) and copied to participating municipalities.

The final report includes:

- comments and feedback submitted by participating municipalities;
- a summary of any changes to the SNC Programs and Services Inventory; and
- an update on cost apportioning agreements with participating municipalities.



Copies of the draft reporting documents will be uploaded to the Member's webpage for the Board's review prior to the meeting.

ADHERENCE TO SNC POLICY:

Ontario Regulation 687/21 requires SNC submit a final version of the programs and services inventory, and confirmation of Category 3 Watershed Programs and Services Agreements to MNRF and participating municipalities prior to January 31, 2024. Staff will bring these documents to the Board prior to submission.

DISCUSSION:

External funding programs have been identified by staff as potential sources of revenue to further South Nation Conservation (SNC) programs and services. The following grant applications will be submitted:

 - **Project:** Enhancing operational flood hazard modelling, mapping, and alerting in the South Nation River Watershed
 - **Request:** \$720,000

 - **Purpose:** This project will leverage existing tools (South Nation River Hydrogeosphere Model) to enhance flood risk prediction and mapping for the South Nation River watershed utilizing state-of-the-art modelling, data, and data delivery technology. SNC will collaborate with Aquanty Inc to build on SNC's innovative flood forecasting tool, recently acquired Lidar and updated landcover to assess local and regional flood risk and to develop the tools
 - **Deadline:** January 24th, 2024
- 2. Honda Canada Foundation:
 - **Project:** Two Creeks Forest Conservation Area Restoration
 - **Request**: \$50,000
 - **Program will fund:** \$50,000+ to charitable, non-profit organizations and other tax exempt, national institutions in the fields of family, environment, engineering and education. No matching funds required.
 - Purpose: To support work necessary to re-open the Two Creeks Forest



Conservation Area. Remove hazard trees and low-quality pulp tree species, replant with native trees, shrubs and plants, resurface trails, and replace one footbridge.

• Deadline: No deadline.

BACKGROUND:

South Nation Conservation (SNC) is delivering the Woodlot Storm Recovery Program to assist private woodlot owners affected by the May 2022 derecho storm. Partners include Natural Resources Canada (NRCan) through the 2 Billion Tree Program; the United Counties of Prescott and Russell (UCPR); and the City of Ottawa.

SNC's Forestry Team completes private woodlot site visits to eligible property owners to assess recovery needs and prepare individual site plans for work. Eligible projects fall into two categories: (1) landowners who completed restoration work on their woodlots and are eligible for reimbursement; and (2) landowners who will rely on SNC forestry staff expertise to complete woodlot restoration via contractors.

Below is a summary of transactions under the Program to date:

- 118 site visits completed
- 13 landowner reimbursements paid
- 19 individual vendors paid for recovery work by landowners or SNC
- 15 vendors provided estimated unit costs for proposed recovery work to be coordinated by SNC

DISCUSSION:

Approximately 14 landowners planned to retain contracted services and submit expenses for reimbursement to expedite recovery work in their woodlots. Quotes were reviewed for eligibility by SNC staff prior to signing project agreements with the landowners.

Clarification to landowners on the ineligibility of the Harmonized Sales Tax (HST) for reimbursement resulted in some concerns from applicants who are not eligible for HST reimbursement through the Canadian Revenue Agency.



To ease financial barriers, SNC can provide direct payment of invoices to contractors for eligible work in lieu of reimbursement to the landowner. SNC will recover costs, including the net of SNC's HST rebate, through the Program's external funding partners.

There are a two significant recovery projects with invoices above \$25,000 that require Board approval. As work was coordinated by the landowner, multiple quotes were not obtained. Invoices were reviewed by Forestry Staff and in their professional opinion, unit costs for work are reasonable and comparable with similar work completed on other recovery projects.

SUBJECT: Extension of Minister's Direction for Conservation Authorities Regarding Fee Changes Associated with Planning, Development and Permitting Fees

I am writing with regards to conservation authority fees for the 2024 year. As you are aware, a Minister's Direction ("Direction") was issued on December 28, 2022, directing conservation authorities not to change fees for programs and services associated with planning, development and permitting for the 2023 calendar year. I have provided a copy of this previous direction for your reference.

Pursuant to my authority under subsection 21.3 (1) of the *Conservation Authorities Act*, I am issuing a new Direction that extends the previous Direction for the upcoming year (attached to this letter as Attachment A). The Direction will be in effect from January 1, 2024 to December 31, 2024 and applies to fees for the same programs and services specified in the Direction that was in effect for 2023.

Minister's Direction Issued Pursuant to Section 21.3 of the Conservation Authorities Act (this "Direction")

WHEREAS section 21.2 of the *Conservation Authorities Act* permits a Conservation Authority to charge a fee for a program or service if the program or service is included in the Minister's list of classes of programs and services in respect of which a Conservation Authority may charge a fee;

AND WHEREAS subsections 21.2 (6) and 21.2 (7) of the *Conservation Authorities Act* provide that a Conservation Authority shall adopt a written fee policy that includes a fee schedule listing the programs and services that it provides in respect of which it charges a fee, and the amount of the fee charged for each program or service or the manner in which the fee is determined (a "**Fee Schedule**");

AND WHEREAS subsection 21.2 (10) of the *Conservation Authorities Act* provides that a Conservation Authority may make a change to the list of fees set out in the fee schedule or to the amount of any fee or the manner in which a fee is determined, provided the authority shall give notice of the proposed change to the public in a manner it considers appropriate;

AND WHEREAS section 21.3 of the *Conservation Authorities Act* provides the Minister with the authority to give a written direction to an authority directing it not to change the amount of any fee it charges under subsection 21.2 (10), in respect of a program or service set out in the list referred to in subsection 21.2 (2), for the period specified in the direction;

NOW THEREFORE pursuant to the authority of the Minister of Natural Resources and Forestry under section 21.3, the Conservation Authorities set out under Appendix "A" of this Direction (the "**Conservation Authorities**" or each, a "**Conservation Authority**") are hereby directed as follows:

Fee Changes Prohibition

1. Commencing on the Effective Date and for the duration of the Term of this Direction, a Conservation Authority is prohibited from making a change under subsection 21.2 (10) of the *Conservation Authorities Act* to the amount of any fee or the manner in which a fee is determined in its fee schedule if such a change would have the effect of changing the fee amount for the programs and services described in paragraphs 2 and 3 of this Direction.

Program and Service Fees Impacted

2. This Direction applies to any fee set out in the Fee Schedule of a Conservation Authority, including without limitation fees for any mandatory program or service



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(Category 1), municipal program or service (Category 2), or Conservation Authority recommended program or service (Category 3) related to reviewing and commenting on planning and development related proposals, applications, or land use planning policies, or for Conservation Authority permitting.

- For greater certainty, this Direction applies to any fees in respect of the following programs or services provided under the Mandatory Programs and Services regulation (<u>O. Reg. 686/21</u>):
 - a. Section 6: programs and services related to reviewing applications and proposals under the Aggregate Resources Act, Drainage Act, Environmental Assessment Act, and the Niagara Escarpment Planning and Development Act, for the purpose of commenting on the risks related to natural hazards arising from the proposal,
 - b. Section 7: programs and services related to ensuring that decisions under the *Planning Act* are consistent with the natural hazards policies in the policy statements issued under section 3 of the *Planning Act* and are in conformance with any natural hazard policies included in a provincial plan as defined in section 1 of that Act,
 - c. Section 8: programs and services related to Conservation Authority duties, functions, and responsibilities to administer and enforce section 28 and its regulations, section 28.0.1, and section 30.1 of the *Conservation Authorities Act*,
 - d. Paragraph 4 of subsection 13 (3): programs and services related to reviewing and commenting on any proposal made under another Act for the purpose of determining whether the proposal relates to a significant drinking water threat or may impact any drinking water sources protected by a source protection plan, and
 - e. Subparagraph 4 iv of section 15: programs and services related to reviewing and commenting on proposals made under other Acts for the purpose of determining the proposal's impact on the Lake Simcoe Protection Plan and the Lake Simcoe watershed.

Application

- 4. This Direction, applies to all Conservation Authorities in Ontario, listed in Appendix "A" to this Direction.
- 5. For greater certainty, this Direction also applies to the Conservation Authorities listed in Appendix "A" to this Direction when such Conservation Authorities are meeting as a source protection authority under the *Clean Water Act, 2006*.

Effective Date and Term

6. This Direction is effective from January 1, 2024 (the "Effective Date").





7. The term of this Direction is the period from the Effective Date to December 31, 2024 (the "**Term**").

Amendments

8. This Direction may be amended in writing from time to time at the sole discretion of the Minister.
