

Conservation Authorities Act



Reveler Conservation Area
North Stormont

- Requirement of the Conservation Authorities Act,
 Section 21.1 and Ontario Regulation 686/21
- Each Conservation Authority must develop a Watershed Based Resource Management Strategy by December 31, 2024
- Opportunity to work with the province to clearly define Conservation Authority work and future support needs



Watershed Strategy




North Grenville Wetland SNC Land Aquisition

The Strategy will help SNC enhance delivery of Mandatory Programs and Services and assess issues and risks that impact effective delivery.

- 1. Set out guiding principles and objectives
- Set out Mandatory Programs and Services, and other watershed Programs and Services
- 3. Identify important reports and studies
- 4. Identify future programs, reports, services, and actions to meet objectives and long-term goals
- 5. Create a business plan for the next 5-years



Information Gathering Stage




Flood Risk Assessment Mapping

- Compiling existing reports, studies, information that help us deliver programs and services:
 - Watershed strategies
 - Watershed report cards
 - Natural hazard reports (i.e. floodplain)
 - Drinking Water Source Protection
 - Forest Management Plans
 - Conservation and Land Acquisition
 - Asset Management Plan
 - Budget and financial forecast
 - Municipal Natural Heritage Strategies/Official Plans



Programs and Services



- 1. Mandatory Programs and Services
 - Defined in regulation
- Other programs and services
 (Category 2 and 3) that support
 Category 1 programs
- 3. Programs and services that don't currently exist but are needed to support Cat 1, 2 and 3 programs (i.e. gaps)



Integrating Programs and Services



- Category 3 Agreements include provisions that those programs and services be included in the strategy
- Link to core programs (Category 1) as ways to address issues/risks
 - sub-watershed plans, education, local monitoring and research, watershed stewardship and restoration
- Information can be used for funding proposals, work plans, budgets, emerging issues, unforeseen opportunities
- Consideration of Climate Change
