Subject:	Update: Estimated Statement of Operations for May 31st, 2025

RECOMMENDATION:

The Board of Directors receive and file the Estimated Statement of Operations for the year ending December 31st, 2025, as of May 31st, 2025, update.

DISCUSSION:

The Net Overall amount represents total expenditures, operating, capital, and project, minus total revenue. The operational budget is the day-to-day expenses the Authority requires for normal activities. Expenses for projects are normally for a fixed term period. Capital expenditures are as per SNC's *Tangible Capital Assets Policy* revised in August 2021. "Tangible" capital assets are goods that have a life expectancy of more than one (1) year, and costs normally over \$5,000, with some exceptions. This Policy can be reviewed at any time, if necessary.

Currently, Senior Management, Team, and Project Leads are estimating a \$172,000 surplus. A full review of 2025 revenues and expenditures will continue through to the end of 2025.

The final 2025 reserve transfer will be presented to the Board along with the audited financial statements at the March 2026 board meeting.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS/ADHERENCE TO SNC POLICY:

Subject:	Request for Approval: Woodlot Storm Recovery Program

RECOMMENDATION:

The Board of Directors receive and file the Woodlot Storm Recovery Program update; and

FURHER THAT: The Board of Directors approve signing an amendment with Natural Resources Canada to extend the 2 Billion Trees Program agreement to 2028 and increase funding for the Woodlot Storm Recovery Program to approximately \$1.5 million in total.

DISCUSSION:

South Nation Conservation (SNC) has been delivering the Woodlot Storm Recovery Program with funding secured from Natural Resources Canada (NRCan) through the 2 Billion Trees Program; the United Counties of Prescott and Russell (UCPR); and the City of Ottawa.

At the February Board of Directors meeting (BD-042/25), the Board was advised that:

- Higher than expected landowner participation
- Project is ahead of planned schedule
- Project 200,000 seedling target to be met by fall 2025
- 2025 project expenditures approved to an upset limit of \$575,000
- Opportunity to plant up to 200,000 additional trees with an amendment to 2 Billion Trees agreement

These factors necessitated an amendment to the 2 Billion Trees agreement to revise cash flow projections to accommodate the change in schedule and request additional funds to plant more trees and cover project overages. SNC and NRCan staff were working towards finalizing an amendment when the Federal election call suspended negotiations.

Pending approval of the funding agreement amendment, SNC temporarily placed new contracts and landowner agreements on hold to reduce financial risk to SNC. During the interim, expenditures were limited to honouring existing contracts and tree seedling orders (seedlings are a perishable commodity) by altering the planting schedule and transferring some of the 2025 spring tree allocation to new sites under the 50 Million Tree Program.

The contract amendment process resumed on May 28th and approval is expected shortly. The amendment will revise the projected cash flow and increase the contribution from NRCan from \$550,000 to over \$1.5 million from 2025-2028. Conditionally, the Federal funding requires a 50:50 match by the end of the project term and recovery of expenditures cannot be made retroactively.



Due to the delay, this means that expenditures incurred in Federal fiscal year 2024-2025 cannot exceed the planned contribution of \$125,000. From January 1, 2025 to March 31, 2025, the resultant shortfall is unknown at this time, but could be as high as \$250,000 to \$300,000. Staff are still working to make all the account transfers based on the tree program re-allocations made this spring. No change is expected to the current approved upset limit of \$575,000. Staff will bring a report to the Board, prior to 2026 budget discussions, with a recommended plan to deal with the expenses incurred prior to April 1st, 2025.

After April 1, 2025, project expenditures will be proportionately higher to the Federal funds to match partner contributions (UCPR, Ottawa, landowners and SNC) already received.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS/ADHERENCE TO SNC POLICY:

<u>Compliance with Budget</u>: Storm Recovery expenditures were included in the 2025 SNC Budget based on the current funding agreement with NRCan (\$125,000). An upset expenditure limit (\$575,000) was approved by the Board of Directors subject to approval of a funding agreement amendment.

<u>SNC Policy Adherence</u>: Expenditures adhere to the SNC Purchasing Policy.
