

Free Tree Pick Up Update

- There were 18 pick up locations throughout the month of May
- 6 Municipalities confirmed matching funds to purchase additional trees
- Over 10,000 seedlings were provided for free to families
- Over 3,000 requests were received

Outreach: Trees for National Nurses Week



SNC partnered with 3 local hospitals in May to thank nurses and healthcare workers for their continued efforts throughout the COVID-19 pandemic

- Partnered with Winchester District Memorial Hospital, Cornwall Community Hospital and the Glengarry Memorial Hospital
- 1,100 Norway and White Spruce seedlings







Outreach: St. Lawrence and Ottawa River Virtual Field Trip



- The St. Lawrence River and Ottawa River Virtual Field Trip is now complete
- Staff are working with School Boards to distribute this field trip out to students before the end of the school year

Outreach: SDG Butterflyway Project





SNC is working with volunteers to promote pollinator-friendly practices in Eastern Ontario

- Liaising with volunteer group on local pollinator projects and initiatives
- Inviting municipal partners to the Canadian Wildlife Federation's Eastern Ontario Community of Practice to work with other Rights-of-Way land managers on pollinator pilot projects along roadways
- Co-hosted a webinar for SDG Butterfly Way volunteers and interested community members on May 28, 2021: 'Natures Best Hope' with Dr. Doug Tallamy



Recreation and Outreach: SD&G Library Storywalk



SNC is partnering with the SD&G Library to host a Storywalk at the Warwick Forest Conservation Area in Berwick

- June 19th & June 20th from 10:00 am Saturday to 3:00 pm Sunday
- A StoryWalk® presents the pages from a picture book for walkers to read as they explore a designated trail



Outreach: Provincial Day of Action on Litter



May 11th was Ontario's new Day of Action on Litter (second Tuesday of May)

- SNC's annual clean up activities in Conservation Areas, along streams, and the annual Cache-In-Trash-Out were cancelled due to COVID-19
- Online social media campaign launched to promote safe community clean up activities, consistent with messaging developed with the Province in 2020 to support the new "Day of Action"
- Staff completed property clean up activities without the use of volunteers



Outreach: Findlay Creek Community Clean Up



Findlay Creek Tree Giveaway, 2018

The Findlay Creek Community Clean Up is now planned for Saturday, June 26th at the Diamond Jubilee Park in Ottawa

- This clean up coincides with the Clean Up the Capital Initiative
- Was previously postponed due to the Stay-at-Home Order
- SNC will once again have native shrubs available for residents assisting in the clean up event



Funding: Support for Wetland and Community Clean-Up



\$3,000 in funding was awarded from UnSmoke Canada to support an environmental clean up in the Findlay Creek Community.

- Funding will help organize some clean-up and restoration work in the Findlay Creek and Leitrim Wetland area
- Programming has been postponed due to the COVID-19 Pandemic
- SNC has permission to defer use of the funding until a larger group of volunteers can safely be organized



Stewardship and Outreach: City of Ottawa Ash Tree Replacement



- Soft program launch in June 2021
 (Communication with waiting list applicants, arborists and partners)
- Full launch in July 2021 (advertising and targeted promotions)



Recreation: New Dock Installation



New dock at the St. Albert Conservation Area



All SNC and partner docks were opened as of May 20th with all seasonal Conservation Areas opened as of May 21st, 2021.

- Portable washroom facilities will be installed and cleaned daily at most sites beginning this week
- New docks have been installed at the Embrun Boat Launch and St. Albert Conservation Area thanks to funding from the United Counties of Prescott-Russell and community partners

Cass Bridge Conservation Area

Communicating Conservation Area restoration work to the public

- SNC recently closed the Cass Bridge Conservation Area in Winchester to help complete ash tree management work
- SNC is currently removing excess logs and ash trees at the Oschmann Forest Conservation Area in Ormond to donate firewood to the House of Lazarus
- Cass Bridge was closed June 7th & 8th
- Oschmann Forest is closed from June 15th to 18th



Recreation: Augusta Park Opening



Augusta Township New Park

- Staff plan to open the new park in Augusta in August, with a soft launch in July 2021
- A Board Report will follow in August to approve the designation and management of the Conservation Area through agreement with the Township of Augusta






- Virtual Event hosted last Fall 2020 to open the property with project partners, more work is planned in 2021-2022 with support from Ontario Power Generation

Protecting People and Property: Floodplain Studies



- SNC was recently awarded three contracts for projects submitted to the National Disaster Mitigation Program for:
 - Bear Brook and Tributaries Floodplain
 - Ottawa River Floodplain
 - SNC/RVCA/MVCA Flood Vulnerability Assessment
- Work will be completed by March 31, 2022
- Staff have been working on collecting information for mail outs and calls on upcoming Floodplain Survey Requests within the City of Ottawa
- Coordinating permission to access private property for survey locations for 80+ properties



Outreach: Ag Canada Survey Requests



Stuffed envelopes to property owners to explain research projects

- SNC was asked to assist Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada with monitoring the effect of varying natural capital on biodiversity population dynamics
- SNC sent letters to residents whose properties are located at municipal drains that are of interest to survey
- Staff collected information for mail outs and called owners to request permission for Federal Government partners to survey municipal drains on a weekly basis
- \$5,650 was received to support this work



Fundraising: Update on Online Donation Portal



SNC's Fundraising Plan was updated at the end of 2019 to support online donations and charitable receipts for donors who contribute funding to SNC Programs, Conservation Areas, Land Securement, Tree Planting and Youth Environment Programs (CMN-046/19)

- \$2,074.31 has been received online through nation.on.ca/donate at SNC's CanadaHelps Portal between January and June 2021
- Since making the switch to the online portal after updating the Fundraising Plan, \$4,711.61 in online donations have been processed (2020-21)




- Since then, 2 donations have been received for memorial benches and 5 donations for memorial trees

SNC continues to maintain public 60 geocaches through it's 3 GeoPassport Tours

- SNC's 3 Geopassport tours are available on our website (Watershed, Historical and Community Lands)
- These projects were supported by funding received from the Province of Ontario in 2017 and 2019
- Tim Jackson continues to support geocache maintenance and has been supporting SNC to deliver GPS training to SHSM high schools students, using geocaches







What is a Watershed?




We all live in a watershed.

SD&G Library

- Requesting \$300
- SNC is partnering with the SD&G Library to host this event at the Warwick Forest on June 19 and June 20, 2021
- The funding will help to cover the purchase of the books, the signage and stakes for the Storywalk



Butterflyway Project

- Requesting \$600 total for 2 different projects (\$300 each)
- 1. Bat house building workshop where the funds will go towards purchasing the supplies needed to build bat houses for private properties and community partners.
- Purchasing signage and flyers to educate people about pollinators. Signs to be provided to individuals who create pollinator patches.



Chesterville Kayak Club

- Requesting \$300
- The Chesterville Kayak Club is planning to hire a trainer to teach members on water safety and general kayak safety.
- The funding will go towards paying the trainer for the kayak safety training to keep costs down for members.



Russell Groves Community Association

- Requesting \$300
- The Committee has worked with the Township of Russell to develop a plan that meets all safety requirements and will enhance park usability for the community.
- The funding will help with purchasing trees for Stiver Park.



Chesterville District Agricultural Society

- Requesting \$300
- The Ag Society is looking to replace dead ash trees at the fairgrounds, as well as installing signage for a learning path.
- The funding will help with purchasing trees for the fairgrounds.



Roxborough Agricultural Society

- Requesting \$300
- The Ag Society is looking to add trees to the Avonmore Fairgrounds to increase shade and add to the landscape.
- The funding will help with purchasing trees for the fairgrounds.



St. Anne's Catholic School

- Requesting \$300
- St. Anne's Catholic School in Cornwall is looking to create a butterfly garden within the school grounds. This garden will be to help students learn about the various types of pollinators and the importance of maintaining a safe habitat for them.
- The funding will help with purchasing dirt, mulch and pollinating plants for the garden.



Russell Township

- Requesting \$1,800
- Russell Township identified a planting plan for their municipal parks to increase the shade, vegetation, habitat and oxygen to the community.
- The funding will help with purchasing trees for each park.
 The municipality will leverage this funding to plant additional trees in each space.



Municipality of Casselman

- Requesting \$900
- The Village of Casselman has requested support to help plant new landscape trees at Doran Park, across the South Nation River from the High Falls Conservation Area
- The funding will help with purchasing the trees for the park to coincide with the Brisson Street Redevelopment Project and new walking trail.
