A Rich History

High Falls Conservation Area, formerly known as the Casselman Conservation Reservoir, was originally owned by the Village of Casselman. The land was purchased by South Nation Conservation (SNC) in 1984, following the construction of a weir across the South Nation River in 1966.

High Falls Conservation Area consists of two parcels of land, on both sides of the River, totaling 5.5 acres.

The area is known for its historical views, particularly of the ruins of the Old Coupal 1910 Dam, which still stands today.

Today it is enjoyed by visitors year round. The park is also home to many fishing derbies throughout the spring and summer.
