From Chesterville, head south on County Road 7, turn right onto County Road 8, turn right onto Mackenzie Road, the final destination will be on your left.

History of the "400"

In 1961, the land was originally managed by the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry (MNRF).

From 1995 to 2014, the property locally know as the "400", came under direct management by the Municipality of South Dundas from MNRF.

In 2014, with community support, the property was purchased by South Nation Conservation (SNC) preserving this property for enjoyment by future generations.





A Natural Treasure

Williamsburg Forest is the perfect place to reconnect with nature!

The 400 acre property offers a diverse range of habitat and natural features including:

- 25 acres of spruce plantations
- 12 acres of provincially significant wetland
- 320 acres of locally significant land

The area also contains a large interior forested area, which provides a prime habitat for both bird and waterfowl. The property is also an important headwater feature to the Hoasic Creek Wetland Complex.

Day-use visitors can enjoy a day of birdwatching, or find one of the many hidden geocaches throughout the area.

Hunting is permitted on the property with a letter of permission from SNC.
